WINTER TENNIS IN WILBERFOSS - Following its most successful fund-raising venture at St Crux in York, the tennis club is pulling out all the stops in an effort to attract juniors to play this enjoyable sport. Firstly, we'd like to extend a warm welcome to Norma Randall who has been co-opted onto the Parish Council. Norma is already heavily involved in the community as a member of the Wilberfoss in Bloom, Yorkshire Countrywomen and Wilberfoss Community Centre Management committee. Norma is looking to give something back to the community that made her feel at home when she moved from the south of England.

We're delighted to announce that residents of Wilberfoss who recycle their glass and plastics in the community recycling facility have made some young children from Wilberfoss Junior Football Club very happy! We're using some of the funds raised through the Recycling Credit Scheme to fund the purchase of a football strip for a newly formed Under 8s team. Thank you to everyone who has contributed by taking their glass and plastics to the bins behind the tennis courts instead of putting them in their blue bin at home. Every item recycled contributes to the funding pot and every penny is reinvested back into the community of Wilberfoss.

These are the names of men who were born in Wilberfoss and who served their country and died in the Great War but their names do not feature on our village War Memorial. We have received a request to rectify the situation and we are in agreement in principle but we would like to encourage any family members of the deceased to come forward so that we may include you in a ceremony to mark their addition to the memorial. Likewise, if anyone is aware of anyone else who was born in Wilberfoss and who served and died in any war, then we would encourage you to come forward too. Did you know that Toxocariasis is an infection caused by the larvae of parasitic worms —*Toxocara canis* and *Toxocara cati* that usually live in the intestines of dogs and cats? Eggs from the worms pass into the faeces of dogs and cats and can contaminate pet areas around the home where kids play. The eggs can be swallowed by children, especially those who like to put things in their mouths and don't often wash their hands. After entering the body, the eggs hatch into larvae that penetrate through walls of the digestive tract and may migrate to a child's liver, lungs, eyes, and elsewhere. Toxocariasis usually happens in young children ages 2 to 7, but can happen at any age. It can't be spread from person to person. If you found this unpleasant to read then imagine how unpleasant it is when someone unwittingly brings it into their home on the bottom of their shoe. An increasing amount of dog foul is being seen in areas of Wilberfoss including the playing fields where children play on a regular basis. We have notified the Dog Warden at East Riding of Yorkshire Council and he will patrol the village on our behalf. Don't forget that a local resident was fined last year for neglecting to pick up their dog's mess.

Wilberfoss "Mavericks" JFC Report - October 2014

Wilberfoss MINI's - Fantastic turnouts for the Mini's over the last month with one Saturday morning having 20 turn up! Even 10 very dedicated Mini's turned up, beginning of October on that very wet morning! Training has continued to focus on shooting and dribbling with passing drills as warm-ups. A few fun games have been introduced prior to the customary game at the end of the session. "Trainee of the Month" for October goes to Harry for his continuous positive learning attitude. But well done to all, I've seen a good general improvement in ability, Dan.

Under 8's - Wilberfoss U8's 4 Vs. 2 Poppleton U8's. A great start to the under 8's first competitive games with a 3-3 draw, followed by a 4-2 win over Poppleton. The first game saw a thrilling 3-3 draw with a hat trick from Jamie Skelton against a much more experienced team, with captain for the first game Lukas Ford defending well and continually leading by example.

The second game saw a fabulous 4-2 win by Wilberfoss. Our less experienced and younger team followed the attitude and enthusiasm shown in the first game and delivered a winning start to what should prove to be a great season for the Wilberfoss Under 8's. Another hat trick this time from Noel Belshaw and a superb strike from Henry Clegg ensuring the win. Captain for the second game was keeper James Partemiu, who played both games and notably grew in confidence during the matches making some fine saves.

The training on a Saturday morning has seen 9 or 10 players turn out each and every week, and further players are always welcome in school years 2 and 3 for this new team. Our next game sees us play our first away match at Tadcaster on the 26th October 2014. Supporters are always welcome.

Under 9's - Wilberfoss U9's 3 Vs. 2 Stamford Bridge U9's - 05/10/2014. Local Derby against a talented Stamford Bridge team. Stamford bridge started brightly and passed the ball well but it was Foss who took an early lead when Charlie Clover-Milne, on the counter attack beat the last defender for pace, carried on to the on-rushing keeper who calmly put the ball into the back of the net. Stamford Bridge quickly responded and the score was level once again, 1-1. Wilberfoss had to get into the game now and battled well but struggled to get the ball out of their half despite the best efforts from Ayres, Shirley and Marsden. Just before half time Stamford nicked another goal, 2-1. Wilberfoss changed formation to 3-2-1 with Oliver Murdoch, making his debut and Rayne O'Brien coming on and bolstering the defence. With Foss looking more confident at the back they continued to counter attack throughout the half. Ayres found himself on the edge of the box and following a good turn and a drag back found himself with a good shooting opportunity, he took it and scored, 2-2. With 5 minutes to go Foss quickly broke once more with an Ayres pass through to Jamie Skelton who smashed the ball towards the goal and Foss were suddenly in the lead, 3-2! Foss managed to hold on nervously for the remaining minutes to record their first win of the season. MOTM went to Taylor Ayres for two assists, a goal and great determination.

Wilberfoss Mavericks U9s 7 Vs. 0 Brooklyn - 12/10/14. A foggy Sunday morning saw the Mavericks host a usually tough Brooklyn.
